
















#### The IAI Work Plan III (2016-2020)

#### ASEAN DECLARATION ON STRENGTHENING EDUCATION FOR OUT-OF-SCHOOL CHILDREN AND YOUTH (OOSCY)

WE, the Heads of State and Government of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (hereinafter referred to as "ASEAN"), namely Brunei Darussalam, the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Republic of Indonesia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR), Malaysia, the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, the Republic of the Philippines, the Republic of Singapore, the Kingdom of Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam, gathering hereby at the 28th ASEAN Summit in Vientiane, Lao PDR:

REAFFIRMING our commitment to the ASEAN Community comprised of three pillars, namely ASEAN Political Security Community, ASEAN Economic Community and ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community, as called for by our leaders at the 12th ASEAN Summit on 13 January 2007;

REAFFIRMING that one of the key purposes of ASEAN as stipulated in Article 1 paragraph 10 of the ASEAN Charter is to develop human resources through closer cooperation in education and lifetiong learning, and in science and technology, for the empowerment of the peoples of ASEAN and for the strengthening of the ASEAN Community;

REAFFIRMING FURTHER the importance of education for children and Article 31 of the ASEAN Human Rights Declaration which states

- a) Every person has the right to education.
- b) Primary education shall be compulsory and made available Secondary education in its different forms shall be available an to all through every appropriate means. Technical and vocation shall be made generally available. Higher education shall accessible to all on the basis of merit.

RECOGNIZING that in parts of the ASEAN region, there is a signific of OOSCY thereby requiring effective measures to enable them to access to education and to benefit from continuous education remain and be retained in school (retention), and to complete suc (completion);

COGNIZANT that all Member States of ASEAN are Parties to the Co the Rights of the Child (CRC), the Convention on the Elimination of of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) and the Convention or of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD), and that the CRC defines a
